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



THE INCEPTION OF THE SWAYAMPURNA GOA MISSION

he idea of initiating an economic revival plan originated in the backdrop of the COVID -19 pandemic, which created enormous strain on the economy of the State. State Governments all over the country were struggling to provide health care to its citizens, but at the same time, there were other concerns of livelihood and revival of their economy. Goa was no exception to this catastrophic situation.

The State of Goa was also affected by the virus and the Government of Goa initiated steps to undertake a systematic approach to understand the needs in different areas for reviving the village economy and in turn to help people overcome issues. The idea was discussed by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Dr. Pramod Sawant at various State Level Disaster Management Committee meetings.

IDENTIFYING INSTITUTIONAL MECHANISM

In order to prepare a strategy for execution of the plan, it was decided to identify relevant institutions and hence the Directorate of Higher Education (DHE) and Goa Institute of Public Administration & Rural Development (GIPARD) were entrusted the task of preparing the report for economic revival for the Panchayats and Municipalities in Goa. The two departments took up the task and put up the proposal for preparing the plan after undertaking a detailed survey of the Village Panchayats. The following objectives were identified and a detailed methodology was adopted.

- 1. To study the socio-economic institutions, natural and human resources, livelihoodaspects of all panchayats.
- 2. To analyze the potential for revival of sectors related to agriculture, animal husbandry, fishing, horticulture, tourism, MSME, traditional means of livelihood etc.
- 3. To study the possibilities of Institutional Strengthening at the village level.
- 4. To analyze the scope of enhancing revenue for the Panchayats.

METHODOLOGY

An exhaustive study was conducted across 25 colleges in Goa. The village panchayats were segregated taluka-wise and each college was assigned a group of 7 – 11 village panchayats.

The Primary Data from the village panchayats was collected from the Sarpanchas and Ward Members through a questionnaire, which was administered through the college representatives by visiting the respective village panchayats. The data from the village panchayat Secretaries was collected through a questionnaire using Google Forms. Various Focus Group Discussions on thematic / sectoral areas such as agriculture, livelihood, women issues, were conducted with the villagers to seek further insight into the issues and concerns of the village.

SECONDARY DATA COLLECTION

The colleges were asked to collect additional information by referring to websites of Ministry of Panchayati Raj, Govt. of India, and Mission Antyodaya data; they were requested to analyze the Gram Panchayat Development Plan of each village panchayat.

FINDINGS & ANALYSIS

The colleges analysed the data and collated the village report consisting of the data captured, and the Focus Group Discussion. The Institutions were given the freedom to come out with innovative ideas and suggestions for revival of local livelihoods and their economy. The report prepared consisted of the aspirations, concerns and demands of the people which would eventually help to take care of their economic development.

APPOINTMENT OF THE CORE TEAM

Upon preparation of the Village Reports, the Core Team compiled the findings which are mentioned in more than 2000 page report based on which a concise and easy to read document was prepared by the Core Team.

REPORT PRESENTATION

The study report on Economic Revival for Village Panchayats was presented to the Hon'ble Chief Minister, consequent to which the team was asked to prepare an Action Plan and a Strategy for implementation of the Plan.

PREPARATION OF AN ACTION PLAN AND IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY

The Core Team prepared a detailed Action Plan and an implementation strategy. The strategy was to enable the Government to meet the many aspirations and concerns to be met. The plan enumerated a detailed list of activities which were grouped into the long term, short term and immediate goals, which the Government would implement and eventually meet the objectives set out in the study for preparing the Economic Revival Plan. The same was also presented to the Cabinet.

THE FORMAL LAUNCH

On October 2, 2020, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Goa, Dr. Pramod Sawant, launched the Aatmanirbhar Bharat Swayampurna Goa program. Inspired by the Aatmanirbhar Bharat – Garib Kalyan Yojana, its primary goal was to ensure human development by delivering government beneficiary-oriented schemes directly to every eligible person, ultimately meeting the aspirations of citizens with minimal government intervention and maximizing the benefits of governance.

To achieve this vision, 237 Government Officers were appointed as Swayampurna Mitras across 191 Village Panchayats, 13 Municipalities, and 1 for the Corporation of City of Panaji. Their main role was to bridge the gap between the public and government institutions.

One of the early challenges was identifying potential beneficiaries within the Panchayats and Municipalities. This challenge was addressed through the appointment of Swayampurna Sahayaks at the grassroots level, who were tasked with gathering essential information.

A major step forward came on August 6, 2021, with the launch of the "Know Your Schemes" service under the Goa Online portal, which enabled citizens to access government benefits at their doorstep.

To further enhance the mission's visibility, a dedicated website (https://swayampurnagoa.goa.gov.in) was developed by Infotech Corporation of Goa Ltd.

Another milestone was reached on October 23, 2021, when the Hon'ble Prime Minister virtually interacted with Swayampurna Mitras, Sarpanchas, Chairpersons, and program beneficiaries. This event was live-streamed on various platforms, including YouTube and local DD Channels.

Following this, the Government of Goa launched the "Sarkar Tumchya Daari" (Government at Your Doorstep) program, which brought government services closer to citizens by organizing camps where public services were made easily accessible. Additionally, the government introduced the "Swayampurna Yuva" initiative to create awareness among the youth about job opportunities. This initiative aimed to increase employment prospects for job seekers while providing a broader pool of candidates for recruiters. The program featured talks by eminent speakers on career and entrepreneurship opportunities, and various government and semi-government departments, as well as banks, participated in the event.

In its first phase, Aatmanirbhar Bharat Swayampurna Goa had a significant impact on citizens, addressing its 10 focal points and extending beyond them. On December 19, 2021, the efforts of various officers involved in the mission were recognized with the release of a Coffee Table Book by Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. The book highlighted key success stories and government initiatives undertaken under this program.




































THE BREAKTHROUGH





First step towards materialization of the Swayampurna Goa Mission post its launch was the appointment of Group 'A' Gazetted Officers of the State as Swayampurna Mitras designated to each village with the primary responsibility of channelizing the link between the Government and its citizens.

Going a step ahead, the Goa Government appointed Swayampurna Sahayaks to visit each ward of the village panchayat to collect the requisite data of eligible beneficiaries from each family within the territories earmarked to them and to aid the Swayampurna Mitra of that particular Village Panchayat.

Seen in this image is one such Swayampurna Sahayak, Sanjiv Bugde under the guidance of his Swayampurna Mitra, Isha Sawant, collecting data from each family residing in the village to procure information in a meticulous fashion pertaining to eligibility of each family and their members for the schemes made available by the Central and State Government.

The data collection process is being proactively completed for all the village panchayats to be covered by the Mission. This breakthrough, of getting onboard, Swayampurna Sahayaks for data collection, could easily be classified as the 'game changing' moment of the Mission that gave every Swayampurna Mitra the much needed impulse to accelerate the velocity at which the Mission is functioning.

GOING BACK TO FARMING

Success Stories



Farming is the profession of hope, and 29-year-old Varad Samant from Goa has set the example by giving up his engineering career to become 'Swayampurna'. Starting with a lady-finger plantation, Varad has grown various crops, including carrots, overcoming myths about the crop's inability to grow on Goan soil. This achievement aligns with Chief Minister Dr. Pramod Sawant's Aatmanirbhar Bharat - Swayampurna Goa.









JAL JEEVAN MISSION



Jal Jeevan Mission,implemented by the Ministry of Jal Shakti, has been successful in providing tap water connections to most households in Goa,India. The state achieved 100%"Har Ghar Nal Se Jal" status, covering 2,30,000 houses, making Goa the first state in India to achieve this milestone. To state one such example, of how the Mitras facilitated people; Ranjita Rajnikant Naik Dhaude, a 55-year-old widowed fisherwoman residing in Salvador do Mundo, received water connection within a week with the help of the Swayampurna Mitra of her village panchayat, Shri. Rajendra Gawade.







ELECTRICITY CONNECTION

Success Stories



Dattaram Ramchandra Mandrekar, an 85-year-old octogenarian living in Salvador do Mundo, lost his family and struggled to afford electricity. The Swayampurna Mitra, Rajendra Gawade, and his Panchayat members facilitated financial support, enabling Dattaram to get an electricity connection. The light illuminated his home, transforming his dream of a brighter life into a reality.







REVIVAL OF AGRICULTURE

Success Stories





Two parcels of lands in Surla, were identified by 22 farmers after natural calamities destroyed them. The Swayampurna Mitra, Subraj Kanekar, stepped in to help revitalize the lands. A proposal was submitted to the Atal Gram Development Agency, and a community farming group produced 2.5 quintal cowpeas. Today, these lands are on the path of rejuvenation.







PROVIDING SHELTER





Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana Gramin (PMAYG) is Government of India scheme aimed at providing housing for the rural poor. It aims to provide basic amenities in a 60:40 ratio between the Central and State Governments. A house was sanctioned to Premavati K. Gaonkar, who completed it in 2020, fulfilling her dream of having a new home.











DEEN DAYAL SWASTHYA SEVA YOJANA

Success Stories

Deen Dayal Swasthya Seva Yojana (DDSSY) Scheme is a Goan state initiative that offers universal health coverage through insurance. The scheme aims to improve access to medical care and financial security for the Goan population. It provides up to Rs. 2.5 Lakhs per annum for families of three or less members and up to Rs. 4 Lakhs for families of four or more.







EMPOWERMENT THROUGH SELF EMPLOYMENT





Reshma Malvankar, an unemployed yet talented woman, sought a sewing machine to start her independent business. She contacted her Swayampurna Mitra, Isha Sawant, and Swayampurna Sahayak, Visulo Vaingankar. With the help of the Rotary Club of Mapusa,through its Rotarians, Rtn. Sachin Mense and Rtn. Abhijeet Walke, donated 21 sewing machines under their Women Empowerment Program, thereby promptly procuring a sewing machine which was then presented to Reshma and others by the Hon'ble Chief Minister within a twinkling span of 7 days







POULTRY FARMING

Success Stories

Nandu Gawas, a Harvalem village resident, sought employment opportunities to achieve self-reliance through the Swayampurna Goa Mission. He successfully benefited from the Gramashakti Poultry Scheme, which encourages rural farmers to try poultry rearing. Swayampurna Mitra Sophia Vaz provided Nandu with the necessary support to start his own enterprise, leading him to establish his own Chicken Centre.







NATIONAL RURAL LIVELIHOOD MISSION (NRLM) FACILITATION











National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM), a government initiative in Goa, aims to reduce poverty by establishing grassroots institutions for the underprivileged. It helped 11 Self Help Groups, including 150 women in Harvalem, establish their own Rural Mart. Through the NRLM, Sophia Vaz, a Swayampurna Mitra, helped these women find a place to sell their products, ensuring they have a place to commercialize their products.



MATSYA SAMPADA

Luis Cardozo, a fishing businessman in Velim village, utilized the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY) to establish his own fish transporting facilities. The PMMSY provided financial assistance to fishermen, enabling them to establish insulated trucks,

reduce losses, increase revenue, and improve hygiene and sanitation. Luis received an insulated truck for Rs. 25 Lakhs, with a government subsidy of Rs. 8 Lakhs. This enabled him to store fish for longer periods, increasing his income.

EMPOWERMENT THROUGH SELF EMPLOYMENT

Success Stories







Mining stoppage had made it difficult for mining dependent families to survive and earn respectable livelihood. A multiprocessing centre set up by Goa State Biodiversity Board offers a new opportunity for 13 ladies from village Pale Kothambi to produce products like jackfruit chips, pickles, Mango pulp, Jackfruit pulp, Amla Candy, Kokum products, chillies, and rice under the brand 'Govan'. The project is supported by the Goa Government and Goa Shipyard Limited's CSR Funds.







EMPOWERING THROUGH SELF EMPLOYMENT





Shraddha Saburi Self Help Group in Assonora, led by Rupali Bugde, faced challenges during festival times due to high orders. They sought assistance from their Swayampurna Mitra, Isha Sawant, who provided them with dough kneading and packaging machines using CSR funds. This has increased efficiency and allowed them to work at industrial speed.





THE REVIVAL

Village Panchayat of Betalbatim has successfully transformed their village into a 'Swayampurna' through an awareness camp and the resurrecting of a stagnant lake, 'Tolloy'. The Sarpanch, Constancio Miranda, and Swayampurna Mitra, Arun Panchwadkar, successfully managed the project, funded by the Department of Water Resources, Goa. The lake is now used for agriculture, fisheries, and recreation, demonstrating the village's commitment to transforming its village.















KUNBI IF YOU CAN





Department of Handicraft, Textile and Coir and Swayampurna Mitra of Assonora, Smt. Isha Sawant, have trained 50 women in 'Kunbi' saree weaving and established two handloom training centers in the village. This initiative seeks to revive the traditional Goan art of Kunbi saree weaving, which is deeply tied to local heritage and culture. The program also aims to empower 10 more women to become skilled trainers, further expanding the reach and impact of this craft revival.

THE RAPONNKARS





Two fishermen from Volvoi village of Goa, Vinayak Shet and Anand Tari, have utilized the Financial Assistance for Construction, Purchase of FRP, Wooden Fishing Crafts Scheme to uplift their traditional fishing community and maintain their livelihood. They were able to purchase one canoe each, preserving their cultural heritage.

VARAHA PALAN





Krishna Anand Sinari Gaonkar, a dairy farmer from Amona, started a piggery in 2018 to increase profitability. He applied for the Varahpalan Scheme, which provides employment opportunities and supplementary income for rural farmers. The Department supported him, and after applying, he has now purchased over 50 pigs, both male and female, to improve his living standards.









CLIMB TO PROSPERITY

Success Stories









In January 2021, the Usgao Panchayat discussed agricultural schemes under the Swayampurna Goa mission, leading to Prasiddh Naik suggesting toddy tapping within the village's jurisdiction. Despite the idea, no takers were found. Panch members selected 3-4 interested contenders for training in toddy tapping. In November 2021, 30 aspirants received training and Toddy Tapping Kits furnished through CSR Funds. Today, 30 men, including Pranay Subrai Gaude, are trained toddy tappers successfully harvesting toddy from Goan palms.











BEST OUT OF WASTE





Goa Waste Management Corporation has created a sustainable waste management system in the Village Panchayat of Cacora. The Swayampurna Mitras have encouraged people to hand over their waste to the Safai Karamcharis, who collect it daily and store it in miniature sheds. The waste is then transported to the Material Recovery Facility (MRF) in Cacora, where it is segregated into recyclable and non-recyclable waste. The recyclable waste is sold to recyclers, funding the MRF, while the non-recyclable waste is sent to cement companies.









THE SWEET SUCCESS

Success Stories

Cotigao Panchayat, with the support of its Sarpanch, Umesh Gaonkar, and Swayampurna Mitra, Vinayak Volvoikar, has established a Jaggery producing unit to help local sugarcane farmers utilize their raw sugarcane stocks. The unit produces 400 kilograms of jaggery daily and can produce 200 kilograms more if night-shifting is added. This initiative not only generates income for locals selling jaggery at Rs. 150 per kilogram but also creates employment opportunities. The Sarpanch has employed about 25 people in the Jaggery trade at the Cotigao Mahila Mart.











KAMDHENU SCHEME

Success Stories





Radhakrishna Kamat, a 32-year-old dairy farmer from Mayem Village, quit his high-paying job to revive his family business. He applied for benefits under the Kamdhenu Scheme under Swayampurna Goa and received 10 cows in July. He also applied for a Milking Machine under the Dairy Equipment Scheme and received a subsidy in October. Radhakrishna is grateful to the Goa Government and the Swayampurna Goa Mission for making his vision a reality.















GRAMEEN URJA



Lourenco Pereira, an octogenarian from Navelim, was granted benefits under the Goa Grameen Urja Yojana (GGUY) to install domestic LPG connections for Below Poverty Line families. This initiative aims to reduce firewood use, pressure on forests, and pollution. Lourenco was successfully covered through the Swayampurna Goa Mission, receiving gas cylinders, stove, regulator, and accessories with a certified ISI mark.











FISHERMEN IDENTITY CARD

Success Stories



Candolina Fernandes, an aged fisher woman hailing from Betalbatim, who raised her children and made ends meet solely by means of sale of fish, was given Fisher women Identity card Card by the Department of Fisheries, Government of Goa which is a facility that meets the short term credit requirement of fish vendors and fish farmers and those who possess fishing nets. Many fishermen have received identity cards and kisan credit cards and are availing benefits.









MAHATMA GANDHI NATIONAL RURAL EMPLOYMENT GUARANTEE ACT (MGNREGA)





Chief Minister of Goa, Dr. Pramod Sawant, initiated the Mahatma Gandhi – National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) project in October 2020 to clean and desilt Tillari and Salaulim Irrigation Project Canals. The project, a flagship of the District Rural Development Agency, generated 1,70,403 man-days and benefited 7,562 local Goan laborers. The project covered 94 kilometers, benefiting 2066 people and 66.41 lakhs, while generating 24,814 man-days and benefiting 1119 people.

EMPOWERING PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES





Ruki Ahmed, a physically disabled individual with a street side stall selling food, is a beneficiary of the Assistance to Disabled Persons for Purchase/fitting of Aids and Appliances (ADIP) Scheme under the Aatmanirbhar Bharat Swayampurna Goa program. With a gold medal in Table Tennis, Ruki was provided with a special wheelchair by the Swayampurna Goa mission, enabling him to achieve his goals.





ON A BAKING SPREE

Success Stories

Government Polytechnic Panaji conducted a 3- month Bakery and Confectionary Course in Salvador do Mundo village, aiming to enhance skill development and entrepreneurship among residents. The course is funded by the Central Government, and conducted free of cost. The course had a large number of participants.







GOA STATE BIODIVERSITY BOARD



Goa State Biodiversity Board (GSBB) has taken a number of initiatives under the Swayampurna Goa mission, which is a government-funded program that aims to make Goa a self-reliant state. These initiatives include:

Promotion of sustainable agriculture practices:

The GSBB is promoting sustainable agriculture practices such as organic farming and agroforestry. This is helping to reduce the use of pesticides and fertilizers, which can harm biodiversity.

Conservation of traditional knowledge: The GSBB is documenting and conserving traditional knowledge about biodiversity. This knowledge is often passed down through generations and can be used to develop sustainable products and services.

Empowerment of local communities: The GSBB is empowering local communities to manage their own biodiversity resources. This is being done through the formation of Biodiversity Management Committees (BMCs). BMCs are responsible for developing and implementing Biodiversity Management Plans (BMPs), which are documents that outline how biodiversity resources will be managed in a sustainable way.

Promotion of ecotourism: The GSBB is promoting ecotourism, which is a type of tourism that is focused on experiencing nature and learning about biodiversity. This is helping to raise awareness about the importance of biodiversity and to generate revenue for local communities.



Here are some specific examples of GSBB initiatives under the Swayampurna Goa mission:

GoVan project: GoVan, a homegrown brand established by the Goa State Biodiversity Board, specializes in creating value-added products using locally sourced produce from Goan farmers. The Multiproduct Processing Unit of GoVAN is supported by corporate social responsibility (CSR) initiatives and has opened up employment prospects for local women. It is bridging the gap between Goa's abundant natural resources and consumers. Through this entrepreneurial venture, the Goa Government is providing a platform for Goan women, empowering them with opportunities to earn a sustainable livelihood. GoVAN, with its focus on promoting Goa's local produce, is playing a pivotal role in fostering the development of the region while empowering Goan women through the optimal utilization of readily available natural resources.

People's Biodiversity Registers (PBRs): The GSBB is assisting Biodiversity Management Committees (BMCs) in developing and maintaining People's Biodiversity Registers (PBRs). PBRs are documents that document the biodiversity resources of a particular area, as well as the traditional knowledge associated with these resources. PBRs are important tools for managing biodiversity resources in a sustainable way.

The Mayem Biodiversity Atlas: is a comprehensive database of the flora and fauna of Mayem village in Goa, India. The atlas was launched in August 2023 and is available online. It includes data on over 1,000 species of plants and animals, including mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians, butterflies, and insects. The data was collected through a yearlong survey of the village, using standard scientific protocols. The atlas is a valuable resource for researchers, students, and anyone interested in the biodiversity of Mayem village.

Ecotourism training program: The GSBB is offering an ecotourism training program to local communities. The program covers topics such as biodiversity, ecotourism principles, and tour guiding skills. The program is designed to help local communities develop and operate ecotourism businesses.

The GSBB's initiatives under the Swayampurna Goa mission are helping to promote sustainable development and to conserve Goa's rich biodiversity.



STRAWBERRY CULTIVATION AT VERLEM NETRAVALI



Directorate of Planning, Statistics & Evaluation has promoted cultivation of strawberries as a part of Aatmanirbhar Bharat Swayampurna Goa Mission, keeping in view to boost Agriculture and Horticulture in the villages to ensure economic upliftment of the farmers. The department has provided all necessary logistic support towards cultivation of strawberries. Training of various durations has been provided to farmers at Netravali through accomplished strawberry farmers.

Atal Gram Development Agency – Goa assisted in cultivation of strawberries in the village of Verlem in the jurisdiction of V. P. Netravali. This scheme has benefited about 12 households in the village of Verlem. The cultivation of strawberries has covered an area of 4500 sq. mts. About 18,000 high yielding varieties strawberry saplings of strawberry – Winter Drawn and Nabila, produced from strawberry farms in Wai, Mahabaleshwar of famous hill station in Maharashtra, have been cultivated at Verlem














KNOW YOUR SCHEMES

SCHEMES, AT YOUR DOORSTEP

On August 6, 2021, the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Dr. Pramod Sawant, launched a pioneering service called "Know Your Schemes" for the citizens of Goa. This innovative platform allows Goans to access detailed information about the various government schemes available to them through the official online portal of the state.

The portal provides comprehensive details on each scheme, including its objectives, eligibility criteria, benefits offered, and how to apply. By making this information readily accessible, the "Know Your Schemes" service empowers citizens to become more informed about government initiatives designed to improve their lives. The government's goal is to ensure that every eligible beneficiary is aware of and can fully utilize the available schemes, ensuring that no one misses out on essential services and support.









'SARKAR TUMCHYA DARI'

Government of Goa launched its 'Sarkar Tumchya Dari' (Government at Your Doorstep) program with the goal of bridging the gap between government services and its citizens, who are the ultimate stakeholders. The vision was to deliver governance directly to people's doorsteps in a phased manner, offering immediate and transparent services that aligned with public aspirations. The day-long program, held from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the constituency level, provided citizens access to services from over 40 State and Central Government departments, all under a single canopy.

The Hon'ble Chief Minister Dr. Pramod Sawant personally reviewed the work undertaken by Swayampurna Mitras allocated to the Panchayats and Municipalities of the respective constituencies. These reviews were broadcasted across his social media handles, showcasing the progress made. With grievance redressal as the primary focus, the Chief Minister ensured that government representatives from the relevant departments diligently addressed the issues raised by locals, clearing pending appeals and even resolving some files on the spot, wherever possible. This approach helped accelerate the process of achieving self-sufficiency among the people.

The program offered a wide range of services, including the issuance of residence certificates, mutation and partition assistance, income certificates, election cards, ration cards, Griha Aadhar Scheme support, child welfare schemes, the DDSSY health check-up program, and various social sector schemes. Citizens could also access services related to electricity and water connections, agriculture welfare schemes, labor welfare schemes, veterinary and tribal welfare schemes, fisheries assistance, registration of wells, irrigation schemes, and the issuance of birth, construction, and occupancy certificates. 'Sarkar Tumchya Dari' became a vital tool for addressing the immediate needs of citizens while ensuring the efficient delivery of government services, bringing governance closer to the people of Goa.









'SWAYAMPURNA YUVA'

Office of the Commissioner, Labour and Employment, Regional Employment Exchange, and Model Career Centre, Government of Goa, organized a significant youth-oriented event titled "Swayampurna Yuva" on October 27, 2021, at DM's College Complex, Mapusa, and on October 30, 2021, at GVM's College Complex, Ponda, Goa. The initiative was a part of Goa's broader mission to uplift the youth through career guidance, skill development, and employment opportunities, aligning with the Swayampurna Goa initiative.

This youth festival brought together over 30 Government and Semi-Government departments and banks, as well as 70 private sector establishments. Esteemed employers such as Micro Lab, Online Productivity Services, Planet Hollywood Beach Resort, Sai Service, Colorcon Asia Private Limited, Goa Marriott Resorts and Spa, Taj, IT Fortune Miramar, MRF, Nestle, CMM, and Lupin participated in the employment fair. The event saw a remarkable turnout of around 8,400 youth who registered in hopes of finding employment and advancing their careers.

A key feature of the event was the series of talks delivered by eminent speakers from various industries. Topics ranged from opportunities in hospitality, banking, the IT sector, agriculture, event management, automobiles, logistics, healthcare, sales, marketing, pharmaceuticals, and more. These sessions aimed to provide the youth with insights into emerging sectors, help them understand industry expectations, and prepare them for future employment challenges.

The employment fair proved fruitful, with over 1,500 vacancies being advertised. Approximately 700 eligible candidates were shortlisted, and 40 individuals received final offer letters from some of the most prestigious employers. This initiative exemplified the commitment of both the Government of Goa and private sector partners to improving employment prospects for the state's youth.

PINK AUTO INITIATIVE



Pink Auto initiative, a women-centric transportation service launched by the Government of Goa in partnership with the Rotary Club of Mapusa, is revolutionizing the way women commute in Goa. This service offers safe, reliable, and affordable rides, exclusively driven by women for women passengers.

As part of the initiative, the Government of Goa, through Economic Development Corporation (EDC) Ltd., has extended subsidized loans and age relaxation for women applicants. The total cost of an auto rickshaw is Rs 3.10 lakh, with the Rotary Club of Mapusa contributing Rs 60,000 as a down payment. The remaining amount of Rs 2.5 lakh is payable at a minimal interest rate of 3%. Women between the age of 18 to 50 years are eligible to avail of this scheme, providing an excellent opportunity for women to build financial independence.

In addition to financial assistance, the Rotary Club also offers driving lessons and self-defense training to equip women drivers with essential skills. The drivers are given pink uniforms to create a distinct identity, and their electric rickshaws are painted pink for easy recognition. The Pink Auto fleet, comprising 20 electric rickshaws, is equipped with GPS tracking and emergency buttons to ensure the safety of passengers.

This initiative not only provides a dependable mode of transportation for women but also empowers women by offering them a source of livelihood. The Pink Auto initiative sets an example for other states and cities in India, showing a clear path towards a more inclusive and equitable society.













Under the Swayampurna Mission, Government of Goa organized a variety of training and field visits for Swayampurna Mitras and Taluka Nodal Officers. The training programs and field visits helped nodal officers to develop the skill and knowledge they needed to provide support to the people of Goa and to stay up-to-date on the latest trends and developments in the field of rural development, Sustainability, Agriculture, Entrepreneurship etc.

Here are some of the trainings and field visits that have been organized for the Swayampurna Mitras and Taluka Nodal Officers:

Orientation Programme for Existing and New Swayampurna Mitras

The first ever training on introduction of the concept of the Swayampurna Goa Mission was organised in the month of September 2020 in the SCERT hall, Porvorim and was conducted by Shri. Narayan Gad, Director of Panchayat, Shri. Dattaprasad Shetkar Addl. Private Secretary to the Chief Minister, Shri. Durgaprasad, Director of Planning and Statistics. Nodal officers and link officers of all major Government departments were also present at the training session. Through these initiatives, Swayampurna Mitras are being empowered with the knowledge and skills necessary to guide local farmers in implementing modern agricultural techniques, thus contributing to the state's goal of achieving agricultural self-sufficiency.

The objective was to explore how these concepts could be replicated in Goa to further the state's development under the Aatmanirbhar Bharat Swayampurna Goa mission.

CODING AND ROBOTICS



Coding and robotics are important skills for students to learn in the 21st century. These skills can help students to prepare for careers in a variety of fields, including science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM).

Under the Swayampurna Mission, the government of Goa is promoting coding and robotics education in schools across the state.

Government of Goa has notified a new scheme Coding and Robotics Education in Schools Scheme in Government and Government-aided high schools.

Under the CARES scheme, the government of Goa has provided training to teachers on coding and robotics education. The government has also provided schools with the necessary equipment and infrastructure to teach coding and robotics.







Scheme took its first step in the Special Schools in the state of Goa; Sanjay Centre for Special Education, St.Xavier's Academy, and Lokvishwas Pratishthan Special School.



CODING AND ROBOTICS



Coding and robotics education has been integrated into the curriculum of schools across Goa. Students are learning how to code and build robots using a variety of platforms and languages, including Scratch, Python, and Arduino.

In addition to the CARES scheme, a number of other organizations are also working to promote coding and robotics education in Goa. For example, the Indian Institute of Technology Goa offers coding and robotics workshops for students and teachers.

The Swayampurna Mission's emphasis on coding and robotics education is a positive development. Coding and robotics are important skills for students to learn in the 21st century. These skills can help students to prepare for career in a variety of fields, including STEM.







GOA MILES



Goencho Taxi Patrao Scheme

A INR 100 Crore MoU has been signed between the Department of Transport- Government of Goa and Goa Miles. The MoU pledges to empower the youth, protect the environment, and elevate Goa's status as a thriving, sustainable, and prosperous state. The MoU is based on a shared commitment with Goa Chief Minister Dr. Pramod Sawant, who believes in the potential of Goan youth and envisions a prosperous and green future for the state.

"Mukhyamantri Goencho Taxi Patrao Scheme," is a scheme launched by the Department of Transport, Government of Goa in collaboration with Goa Miles in March 2023 to provide employment opportunities to youth in the state. Under this scheme, the government is providing CNG taxis to unemployed youth without any margin money. The taxis are provided on a lease basis, and the youth are required to repay the loan in installments over a period of five years.



The scheme is aimed at providing a source of livelihood to unemployed youth in the state. It is also aimed at promoting the use of CNG taxis, which are more environmentally friendly than petrol or diesel taxis.

This scheme aims to reach the most remote corners of Goa and enable villages without significant tourist footfall to participate in the tourism economy. The scheme also aims to create livelihoods for Goan youth through an investment commitment of up to INR 100 Crore in phases, empowering them to become transport entrepreneurs and contributing to the state's economic growth in the E-rickshaw, E Taxi, and E Bike segments.



The scheme has been well-received by youth in Goa. Over 1,000 youth have applied for the scheme, and the government has already provided taxis to 500 youth.

'SWAYAMPURNA' CENTRAL JAIL COLVALE



There are a number of initiatives being undertaken to make the Central Colvale Jail Swayampurna. These initiatives include:

Vocational training: The jail provides vocational training to inmates in a variety of skills, such as farming, dairy farming, sanitary pad manufacturing, handicrafts, and sewing and tailoring. The vocational training helps the inmates to develop new skills and to become self-reliant after they are released from prison

Handicrafts: The inmates of the jail produce a variety of handicrafts, such as wood carvings, coir products, cane and bamboo weaving, paper items, coconuts shell, seashell crafts, and sewing and tailoring items. The handicrafts are sold at a number of outlets in Goa, including the jail itself, the Goa Tourism Development Corporation (GTDC) shops, and various handicrafts markets. The handicrafts provide the inmates with a source of income and help them to develop new skills. The handicrafts also help to promote the culture and heritage of Goa. The handicrafts made in Colvale Jail are a unique and special souvenir of a visit to Goa. They are also a way to support the inmates of the jail and help them to reintegrate into society.

Sanitary Pad Manufacturing Unit: It was started in 2023 as part of the Swayampurna Goa 2.0 initiative. The unit employs female inmates, and has also provided vocational training to the female inmates. The sanitary pad manufacturing unit is a significant step towards empowering female inmates and providing them with vocational training. It is also helping to make sanitary pads more affordable and accessible to women in Goa. The sanitary pad manufacturing unit is a positive example of how prisons can be used to rehabilitate inmates and prepare them for reintegration into society. It is also a reminder of the importance of empowering women and providing them with economic opportunities.

Gaushala: It was inaugurated in April 2022 by Hon'ble Chief Minister Pramod Sawant as part of the Swayampurna Goa 2.0 initiative. The cowshed is home to a number of cows, and the milk produced is used to feed the inmates of the jail. The cow dung is also used to generate biogas, which is used for cooking and other purposes in the jail.

Bakery Unit: The jail has a bakery unit, where inmates learn baking skills and produce a variety of goods, including bread, samosas, pakodas, snacks. The bakery is part of the jail's vocational training program, which aims to provide inmates with skills that they can use after they are released from prison.

The bakery products are sold to the public at a discounted price. This helps to reduce the cost of running the jail and also provides inmates with an opportunity to earn money. The money earned by the inmates is used to purchase supplies for the bakery and to provide inmates with a small stipend.

The Colvale Jail bakery is a successful example of a prison vocational training program. It provides inmates with the opportunity to learn valuable skills that they can use to find employment after they are released from prison. It also helps to reduce the cost of running the jail and to generate revenue for the government.

Chapati Making Unit: There are two chapatti making units in Colvale Jail. One was donated by ICICI Foundation and Street Province. The Chapati making unit helps to reduce the cost of running the jail by eliminating the need to purchase chapatis from outside vendors. In future the jail aims to generate revenue for the jail by selling chapatis to government hospitals and offices in Goa.



Candle Making Unit: The jail has a dedicated candle making unit where the inmates are taught the basics of candle making and create their own candles. The jail also sells the candles to the public, which helps to generate revenue for the jail.

Paper Bag Making Unit: The inmates make paper bags from recycled paper. The bags are 100% biodegradable and are sold to pharmacies in the state. The proceeds from the sale of the bags are used to provide inmates with a stipend and to purchase raw materials for the project.

Carpentary Unit: The carpentry unit is staffed by skilled carpenters who teach the inmates the basics of the craft. The inmates then have the opportunity to create their own unique products, such as Chairs, Tables etc. These carpentry products from Colvale Jail are sold to courts. Nursery: Colvale jail has started a nursery unit where they have propagated variety of plants The inmateswill start selling the plants in open market soon.

To track the real time progress of the Swayampurna Mission, Hon'ble Chief Minister Dr. Pramod Sawant has launched "Swayampurna Reporting Portal".

All the Swayampurna Mitras are required to upload weekly reports on the Swayampurna Dashboard which will be available to be viewed by the Chief Minister's office. These reports should summarize the work that the Swayampurna Mitras have completed during the week, as well as any challenges they have faced.

By virtue of this portal,

- The Chief Minister can track the number of people that Swayampurna Mitras have helped each week or month. This data can be used to measure the reach of the program and to identify areas where more efforts and outreach is needed.
- The Chief Minister can track the types of services that Swayampurna Mitras are providing. This data can be used to identify the most popular services and to ensure that Swayampurna Mitras are trained to provide these services effectively.





- The Chief Minister can track the challenges that Swayampurna Mitras are facing. This data can be used to identify areas where the program needs to be improved, such as providing Swayampurna Mitras with better training or support.

Shri Saptakoteshwar is the 'Raj Daivat' of Goa. The history of temple, originally situated at Naroa, Diwar, Tiswadi, goes back to Kadamba Dynasty rule. It was desecrated by Bahamani rulers, rebuilt during Vijayanagar rule. It was again destroyed by Portuguese rule in 1540.

Fearing the destruction, the temple was shifted to Narve, Bicholim, at present location. The Present temple was built by Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj in 1668. The temple is located in a cave in the laterite hills of Narve. The temple was in a dilapidated condition and in need of restoration.

The restoration of the temple was undertaken by Goa Archives and Archeology department under Swayampurna Goa Mission. During the renovation the 'Kaavi' art form of wall decoration was executed, to revive the art.

The temple has been renovated at a cost of Rs 7.7 crore. Of this, the directorate of archives and archaeology has spent Rs 6.5 crore on civil works, Rs 70 lakhs on the electrification of the temple and Rs 51 lakh on consultant fees.

The restored temple was inaugurated by Hon'ble Chief Minister, Dr. Pramod Sawant.

PRAKRITIK SHETI



Prakritik Sheti(Natural farming) can be defined as chemical-free farming that uses only natural inputs. Well-grounded in agro-ecology, it is a diversified farming system that integrates crops, trees and livestock, facilitating optimal use of functional biodiversity.

Natural farming provides a strong basis for increasing farmer's income while providing many other benefits, such as restoration of soil fertility and environmental health, and mitigation or minimization of greenhouse gas emissions. Natural farming is based on natural or ecological processes that exist on or around farms.

The Governor of Goa, Shri P. S. Sreedharan Pillai in the presence of Governor of Gujarat, Shri Acharya Devrath launched the project "Prakritik Sheti" (Natural Farming) organized by the Directorate of Agriculture at Raj Bhavan Dona Paula in September 2022.

Governor of Gujarat, Shri Acharya Devrath in his address highlighted the importance of natural farming.

Hon'ble Chief Minister, Dr.Pramod Sawant called upon farmers to fulfill our basic requirements of vegetables, fruit, milk, for which we depend on other States. The Government intends to ensure that central Government and State Government schemes reach needy people in the State to achieve the goal of self-reliance. He appealed to the people to cooperate with the Government by undertaking farming on a large scale to make Goa self reliant.











"VISION FOR ALL" PROGRAMME



Government of Goa has launched the Phase 2 of Vision for All School Eye Health programme. This programme is a collaborative effort between the Directorate of Planning, Statistics, and Evaluation, the Directorate of Education, and Prasad Netralaya Super Speciality Eye Hospital from Udupi, Karnataka, along with support from ONESIGHT Essilor Luxottica Foundation.

During the first phase, a total of 2,05,029 students from 1,448 schools were screened, and 29,725 of them were identified for phase-2 eye check-ups.

Vision for All initiative will be implemented in all 12 talukas. Eye Examinations have been conducted for the students of Bicholim and Sattari Taluka. Currently the eye examinations are being conducted in Ponda and Dharbandora Taluka.

The Vision for All School Eye Health have trained 2000 teachers on basic visual acuity tests for the children in their respective schools, followed by detailed refraction by qualified professionals from Prasad Netralaya. 30,000 Students have been referred for checkup by the teachers and; Prasad Netralaya Foundation has committed to providing 25,000 free spectacles to students identified with refractive error.









CHINTAN SHIVIR - GOA VISION AT 2047



Chintan Shivir was a brainstorming camp organized under the Swayampurna Goa initiative to discuss and generate ideas for improving the quality of life in Goa. The camp was open to all interested participants, including government officials, civil society members, and the general public.



State Government has launched the "Mukhyamantri Annapurna Yojana" with a focus on empowering Self Help Groups (SHGs) by making them self-reliant. This scheme provides a unique opportunity for SHGs to operate canteens in various government departments, thereby creating sustainable income sources and enhancing their economic independence.


In a pioneering move, the state also introduced the Chavath e-Bazaar—an online platform created specifically to market homemade sweets and decorative items crafted by Mahila SHGs during Ganesh Chaturthi. This initiative marked the first of its kind in the country, showcasing the government's commitment to promoting local artisans and their products.





Building on this success, the government has launched a permanent e-business platform, "Swayampurna Goa e-Bazaar" (www.swayampurnagoa.com). This platform is designed to facilitate the sale of homemade and handmade products, including eatables and decorative items, crafted by local artisans, Mahilas, and SHGs. The Swayampurna Goa e-Bazaar enables these entrepreneurs to reach customers not only within Goa but across India, providing them with a broader market and helping them achieve greater financial stability.

Through these initiatives, the government is fostering an environment of self-reliance and entrepreneurship among Mahila Self Help Groups, ensuring that their skills and products receive the recognition and market access they deserve.

PM VISHWAKARMA YOJANA



Prime Minister Vishwakarma Yojana (PMVY) is a transformative initiative aimed at empowering traditional artisans, often referred to as Shramjeevis, across India. By providing them with comprehensive support, the scheme seeks to revitalize their livelihoods and contribute to the nation's economic growth.

The PMVY focuses on artisans engaged in 18 specific traditional trades. These include carpenters, boat makers, armorers, blacksmiths, tool kit makers, locksmiths, goldsmiths, potters, sculptors, cobblers, masons, basket/mat/broom makers, doll & toy makers, barbers, garland makers, washermen, tailors, and fishing net makers.

To participate in the scheme, artisans must register on the dedicated PMVY portal. Upon successful registration, they are issued a unique identification card, serving as their official membership in the program.





Recognizing the importance of skill development, the PMVY offers a 5-day training program for each of the 18 trades. These training sessions are conducted at designated centers within each block, ensuring accessibility for all eligible artisans. Upon completion of the training, beneficiaries receive a Rs. 2500/- traveling allowance to cover their expenses.

To facilitate their work and business growth, the scheme provides substantial financial and marketing support to the artisans. Each beneficiary receives an e-voucher worth Rs. 15000/- for the purchase of necessary tools and equipment. Moreover, the PMVY offers collateral-free loans of up to Rs. 1 lakh at a nominal interest rate of 5%. For those who successfully repay their initial loan, a second loan of up to Rs. 2 lakh is made available immediately.



PM VISHWAKARMA YOJANA





33000 Shramjeevis have been registered on the PM Vishwakarma portal .Goa was the first State in the country to start training programmes for the Shramjeevis. The PMVY is aligned with the broader goals of Swayampurna Goa, and the state can leverage the scheme's potential to empower traditional artisans, preserve cultural heritage, and promote economic growth.









SARAS 2023: EMPOWERING RURAL ARTISANS AND PROMOTING HANDICRAFTS



Goa Saras 2023, held in Margao and Mapusa, was a vibrant celebration of rural craftsmanship and entrepreneurship. This annual exhibition, organized by the Goa Rural Development Agency, aimed to provide a national platform for artisans and Self Help Groups (SHGs) from across India to showcase and sell their handcrafted products. 



The Purple Fest featured an exhibition of assistive aids and emerging technologies designed to meet the diverse needs of the community. EMA showcased innovative solutions to infrastructure inaccessibility and offered informative accessibility explainer videos, promoting understanding of accessibility standards and laws. An introductory workshop for an advanced Accessibility Training Course attracted 12 participants eager to enhance their skills.







A transformative Assistive Devices Distribution Camp was organized by Swayampurna Mitras in their Respective Village Panchayats under the Assistance to Persons with Disabilities for Purchase/Fitting of Aids and Appliances (ADIP) Scheme. This initiative, in collaboration with the Artificial Limbs Manufacturing Corporation of India (ALIMCO), aimed to provide essential support to those in need, ensuring that assistive devices reach the most deserving individuals.

The camp served as a vital platform, assessing the needs of 520 individuals with disabilities. 






CASHEW FEST GOA 2024: CELEBRATING GOA'S ICONIC CASHEW CULTURE

Goa's cashew industry produces 25,800 tonnes annually, employing 3,500 workers across 20 processing units, making it a key contributor to the state's economy.



Over 50 exhibitors participated, showcasing a range of cashew products, including roasted cashews, cashew feni, and unique cashew-based dishes. The festival also highlighted modern machinery used in cashew farming and processing.

One of the primary goals of the festival was to empower women-led rural self-help groups (SHGs) and provide a platform for local farmers and entrepreneurs. This aligns with efforts to sustain the cashew industry and create economic opportunities for rural communities.

The Department of Legal Metrology, under the Swayampurna Goa 2.0 initiative, collaborated with the District Rural Development Agency, the Directorate of Planning and Statistics, and the Directorate of Food & Drugs Administration to host the event at Ravindra Bhavan Sankhali.

The celebration highlighted the Legal Metrology Department's proactive efforts in consumer awareness, including the establishment of consumer clubs in educational institutions and statewide outreach to students, startups, and Self-Help Groups (SHGs).

Dr. Pramod Sawant, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Goa, also serving as Minister for Legal Metrology, has been dedicated to supporting micro women entrepreneurs by ensuring government schemes reach those in need. A budget of Rs.12 crore was allocated under Swayampurna Goa 2.0 to foster women's entrepreneurship and support SHGs.

Notably, five ITIs—Farmagudi, Bicholim, Cacora, Mapusa, and Vasco—had been upgraded to Centres of Excellence, equipped with state-of-the-art facilities, thanks to a Rs.165 crore investment from TATA Technologies Limited and matching grants from the State Government.

Swayampurna Mitras were instrumental in identifying artisans from remote areas, including Pernem and Sanguem, who also participated in the Skill Exhibition. Under the Pradhan Mantri Vishwakarma Yojana, Shramjeevis/Vishwakarmas were enrolled and received a Rs. 2,500 training allowance and Rs.15,000 in e-vouchers for tools and equipment. These beneficiaries received advanced re-skilling and up-skilling training at various ITIs in Goa, with their skills on display at the exhibition.

Approximately 40 successful entrepreneurs exhibited their work at the Skill Exhibition. The Directorate of Planning, Statistics, and Evaluation requested the Directorate of Education to arrange visits for students from standards VIII through XII to the exhibition.

During the program, four trainees who received Medallions of Excellence at the National Skill Competition in New Delhi in 2024 were honored by the Chief Minister. Dr. Sawant expressed appreciation to TATA Technologies Limited, Daikin AC Technology Limited, TAJ Cidade Goa Horizon, TAJ Group Goa, Jaquar, and Putzmeister for their support. The event also featured virtual connections with five Centres of Excellence, where three student trainees thanked Dr. Pramod Sawant for the enhanced opportunities provided through the upgraded LTLs, reflecting the ongoing commitment of Swayampurna Goa to skill development and local entrepreneurship.

This virtual interaction, organized by the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development in collaboration with the Department of Agriculture, Government of Goa, provided an opportunity to discuss key developments and future strategies. The Union Minister praised the Government of Goa, led by Hon'ble Chief Minister Dr. Pramod Sawant, for effectively leveraging centrally sponsored schemes alongside state initiatives. Goa's commitment to supporting its farmers is evident through the implementation of various schemes that promote crop farming, horticulture, dairy farming, and aquaculture. These efforts are not only empowering farmers but also positioning Goa on the path to self-reliance in the near future. The union minister assured continued support from the Central Government in addressing critical issues, including the challenges related to Khajan land, with steps already being initiated to resolve these concerns.











Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM), launched by the Government of India on October 2, 2014, by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, is a nationwide campaign aimed at promoting cleanliness and sanitation across the country. The mission is divided into two major components:

Objectives of SBM Mission:

- Eradication of open defecation by providing access to individual household toilets.
- Establishment of community and public toilets in densely populated areas.
- Scientific solid waste management through segregation, collection, and processing of waste.
- Behavioral change and public awareness on cleanliness and sanitation.

The Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM), a nationwide initiative launched in 2014, has transformed villages and towns across India by emphasizing sanitation and waste management. In Goa, the Directorate of Panchayats has played a key role in ensuring the successful implementation of the mission, with significant achievements in both phases of SBM.

Phase I (2014-2019): 100% Sanitation Coverage

The first phase of SBM Grameen in Goa aimed to achieve 100% sanitation in villages. The Goa Waste Management Corporation (GWMC) successfully constructed 18,006 Individual Household Latrines (IHHL) from 2018 to 2021. To address any remaining sanitation gaps, the Public Works Department is collaborating with M/s Sulabh International to construct additional toilets for left-out beneficiaries.

Phase II (2020-2025): ODF Plus and Sustainable Waste Management

Phase II of SBM Grameen focuses on maintaining Open Defecation Free (ODF) sustainability, solid and liquid waste management (SWM and LWM), and promoting visual cleanliness across villages. Out of 191 village panchayats in Goa, 84 panchayats have initiated various SWM/LWM projects under SBM grants. These initiatives include:

- Material Recovery Facilities (MRFs)
- Bio-methanation plants for organic waste
- Drum composters
- · Plastic shredders and bailing machines

Village panchayats now send non-biodegradable waste to processing plants in Cacora, Saligao, and Verna for further treatment, contributing to a more efficient waste management system. Wet waste from certain blocks is directed to the Cocora and Saligao plants for scientific treatment.

Waste Management Infrastructure Development

In 2021-2022, several biogas plants were commissioned under SBM, including:

- A 5 TPD Biogas Plant at Chicalim
- A1TPD Biogas Plant at Usgao Ganjem
- A 3 TPD Biogas Plant at Cortalim Additionally, new MRF sheds were constructed in multiple village panchayats, including Chicalim, Colvale, Camurlim, and Kalay. This infrastructure has greatly enhanced the state's waste collection and processing capabilities.

Phase II Achievements and Upcoming Projects

Under SBM Phase II, village panchayats have continued to receive support for waste management equipment, including e-rickshaws and garbage vehicles. The construction of new MRF sheds and biogas plants is ongoing, with additional Fecal Sludge Treatment Plants (FSTP) and Sewage Treatment Plants (STP) being commissioned in villages such as Chicalim and Cortalim.

Community Involvement and Education

As part of Swachh Bharat's focus on community-driven initiatives, Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) activities were conducted across villages. Competitions, cleanliness drives, and health camps for sanitation workers were organized to engage the public in maintaining cleanliness and sanitation standards. Furthermore, Goa is celebrating the 10th anniversary of the SBM Grameen by implementing new schemes and upgrades in waste management infrastructure.

The Swachh Bharat Mission in Goa represents a long-term commitment to a clean and sustainable future. By addressing critical challenges in sanitation and waste management, Goa's Directorate of Panchayats, in partnership with GWMC and other agencies, is transforming its villages into model ODF Plus communities, contributing to the overall vision of a Swachh Bharat.



REVIVING TRADITION: THE RESURGENCE OF BEE FARMING IN GOA



In a transformative initiative aimed at revitalizing traditional businesses and leveraging the rich natural resources of Goa's forests, bee farming is making a significant comeback. Under the Aatmanirbhar Bharat Swayampurna Goa campaign, the government is empowering rural women by facilitating access to bee farming and honey extraction equipment, alongside refresher training programs.

This revival is not just about honey production; it embodies a broader vision of self-entrepreneurship and financial independence for women in rural areas. By equipping them with the necessary skills and tools, the government aims to foster a sense of autonomy and resilience, encouraging women to thrive in their communities.





Swayampurna Mitra Salelkar has been instrumental in facilitating this program, ensuring that participants receive both the resources and guidance needed to succeed. The initiative not only supports individual entrepreneurs but also contributes to the local economy by promoting sustainable practices that harness the region's natural wealth.

As these rural women embark on their bee farming journeys, they not only revive a traditional practice but also pave the way for a sustainable future, embodying the spirit of Swayampurna—self-reliance and empowerment for all.





EMPOWERING THE DIFFERENTLY ABLED





Tablets equipped with the 'Aavaz' application were distributed. This technology is designed to assist special needs students by facilitating better communication and learning. The 'Aavaz' application includes features specifically developed to support students with speech and communication challenges, thereby enriching their educational experience and promoting greater inclusion in the classroom.

By providing these technological tools, the program aims to enhance both mobility and educational opportunities, demonstrating a commitment to building a more inclusive society.

Dr. Pramod Sawant, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Goa was the chief guest of the event and his remarks at the event emphasized the importance of such initiatives in fostering an environment where every individual has the resources and support needed to thrive. This effort aligns with ongoing government policies focused on inclusivity and accessibility, ensuring that advancements in technology and support systems reach those who need them most.

In a noteworthy effort to promote inclusivity and support education, electric vehicles (EVs) were distributed to Divyang individuals and tablets embedded with the 'Aavaz' application were given to special needs students. This initiative was carried out under the Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) program of Petroleum Corporation Limited (PCL) and in collaboration with the State Commission for Persons with Disabilities.

This marked a significant step in enhancing mobility and accessibility for people with disabilities. The EVs were provided with an aim to improve the independence and daily convenience of Divyang individuals, reflecting a broader commitment to integrating people with disabilities into the mainstream community.







IEC IN WASTE MANAGEMENT



IEC (Information, Education, and Communication) plays a pivotal role in promoting sustainable waste management practices. By raising awareness, educating leaders, and fostering behavioral change, IEC campaigns can significantly reduce waste generation, improve recycling rates, and minimize environmental impact.

In a crucial step towards promoting sustainable waste management practices, Taluka Nodal Officers, Block Development Officers (BDOs), and Chief Officers participated in a comprehensive training session on Waste Management Best Practices at the Goa Waste Management Office, Saligao Plant. The session was aimed at empowering these key officials with knowledge and hands-on exposure to the latest and most effective strategies in waste management.IEC (Information, Education, and Communication) plays a pivotal role in promoting sustainable waste management practices. By raising awareness, educating leaders, and fostering behavioral change, IEC campaigns can significantly reduce waste generation, improve recycling rates, and minimize environmental impact.









The training focused on enhancing the capacity of local administrative officers to implement sustainable waste management initiatives in their respective jurisdictions. By familiarizing them with the processes and technologies used at the Saligao Waste Management Plant, the goal was to improve waste handling, segregation, and disposal methods at the taluka and village levels.

The session emphasized the importance of scientific waste management practices, including source segregation, waste reduction, and the establishment of Material Recovery Facilities (MRFs) to promote recycling and reduce landfill dependence. This initiative marks a significant milestone in Goa's efforts to create a garbage-free and sustainable environment, contributing to a cleaner and greener future for the state.



GOVERNMENT SUPPORTS CLAY IDOL MAKERS IN GOA



Government of Goa has implemented a subsidy scheme to support clay Ganesh idol makers, promoting ecofriendly alternatives to the environmentally harmful Plaster of Paris (PoP) idols. This initiative, managed by the Goa Handicraft Rural and Small Scale Industries Development Corporation (GHRSSIDC), aims to preserve traditional clay idol-making crafts while discouraging the use of PoP idols during Ganesh Chaturthi.

As of 2024, the subsidy has been doubled from 100 to 200 per idol, applicable to a maximum of 250 idols per artisan. The scheme is available to the first 388 registered artisans who craft clay idols themselves, ensuring these idols are not procured from outside Goa. This is part of the government's broader push to promote environmentally friendly practices and support local artisans.

Over the past five years, a total of 2,391 artisans have benefited from the scheme, receiving a total disbursement of Rs $2.54\,\mathrm{crore}$.

To further protect the environment, the Goa State Pollution Control Board has once again issued an advisory banning the manufacturing, sale, import, and use of PoP Ganesh idols in the state.









KHOLA CHILLI: CELEBRATING AGRICULTURAL HERITAGE OF GOA



Khola Chilli, also known as the Canacona Chilli, has received recognition as a Farmer Plant Variety from the Protection of Plant Varieties and Farmers' Rights Authority (PPV&FRA), marking a significant milestone for the state's agricultural heritage. As the first Farmer Plant Variety from Goa to be officially registered with the Plant Varieties Registry, this development is not only a testament to the unique characteristics of the Khola Chilli but also a celebration of the hard work and dedication of local farmers.

The Khola Chilli, known for its distinctive flavor and vibrant color, is a staple in Goan cuisine. It is cherished for its culinary versatility, adding depth and spice to a variety of dishes. Beyond its gastronomic appeal, the Khola Chilli holds cultural significance for the people of Goa, often featuring in traditional recipes and festivals.

The registration of the Khola Chilli ensures the protection of its genetic diversity, which is crucial for preserving the variety against commercial exploitation and the loss of traditional farming practices. By designating the Khola Chilli as a Farmer Plant Variety, the PPV&FRA acknowledges the vital role of local farmers in cultivating and maintaining this unique crop. This recognition empowers farmers and affirms their rights to save, use, and share seeds.

The focus on indigenous varieties like the Khola Chilli promotes sustainable agricultural practices. It encourages farmers to cultivate traditional crops that are well-adapted to local conditions, thereby enhancing biodiversity.







The acknowledgment of the Khola Chilli as a Farmer Plant Variety opens doors for further research and development. It paves the way for initiatives aimed at improving cultivation techniques, pest management, and the preservation of the variety. Additionally, this recognition could inspire efforts to register more indigenous varieties from Goa, contributing to the region's agricultural diversity.



SCHOOL NUTRITION GARDEN: FOSTERING HEALTH AND LEARNING THROUGH AGRICULTURE



Nearly 950 of the schools in Goa have developed school nutrition (kitchen) gardens by involving students so that they learn the skill of growing their own food. The School Nutrition Garden, part of the PM POSHAN initiative, is a key effort to tackle hunger and malnutrition among children. These gardens provide fresh, nutritious vegetables for midday meals, promoting healthy eating and organic farming practices. By connecting students with the source of their food, the gardens encourage outdoor activity and teach the importance of a nutrient-rich diet. Additionally, they offer hands-on learning experiences, fostering an appreciation for nature and agriculture.

A School Nutrition Garden is a dedicated space within school grounds where herbs, fruits, and vegetables are grown specifically for Mid-Day Meals. The garden reconnects students with nature, imparting valuable agricultural skills while offering nutritious produce. The primary goal is to allow students to participate in the process of growing food—from seed to harvest—creating a rewarding relationship with the environment.

By supplying freshly grown vegetables directly into mid-day meals, these gardens combat malnutrition and educate children about the benefits of consuming fresh produce. The Directorate of Education (DoE) has recently mandated that vegetables from these gardens be incorporated into mid-day meals, further emphasizing their importance in promoting healthy eating habits.

The Programme Approval Board (PAB) has recognized the significance of school nutrition gardens and has advised the state to prioritize their development in all schools. Schools are allocated funds to support the establishment and maintenance of these gardens, and collaboration with local agricultural and horticultural departments is encouraged to maximize resource utilization. Additionally, funds from the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS) can be leveraged to support these initiatives.









One of the most innovative aspects of school nutrition gardens is their adaptability. Contrary to the belief that they require large plots of land, these gardens can thrive in pots and containers, making them suitable for urban schools with limited space. Climbing varieties like snake gourd can be cultivated vertically, optimizing space utilization.



SWAYAMPURNA PANCHAYAT: V.P. HARVALEM





Village Panchayat Harvalem has actively participated in the Swayampurna Goa 2.0 initiative, achieving significant milestones for the welfare of its residents. With the support of the Swayampurna Mitra, the Panchayat has undertaken numerous development projects, focusing on sanitation, infrastructure, and community empowerment. This initiative has successfully empowered Harvalem Panchayat, transforming it into a self-sufficient village where the local community takes control of its economic and social development.

Key Pillars of Transformation

Empowerment of Self Help Groups (SHGs)

One of the key pillars of this initiative has been the training and empowerment of Self Help Groups (SHGs). The government has provided comprehensive training in essential skills such as packaging, branding, marketing, and pricing. By equipping these groups with the necessary tools, the government has enabled them to produce high-quality products that can compete in the market.





Waste Management Initiatives

Effective waste management has also been a critical focus of the Swayampurna Goa initiative. The government has implemented waste segregation and collection systems to ensure responsible and sustainable waste management. A Material Recovery Facility (MRF) has been established to sort dry waste, while wet waste is composted, improving the environmental health of the village and creating opportunities for waste management businesses.

Local Entrepreneurship Support

To encourage local entrepreneurship, the government has facilitated the establishment of small businesses by providing necessary resources and support. This has included assistance in setting up of 2 eatery stalls and other small-scale ventures, fostering a culture of entrepreneurship that creates employment opportunities and boosts the local economy.

Decentralization of Essential Services

Moreover, the government has simplified the process of obtaining essential documents such as residence, birth, and marriage certificates. Previously, villagers had to travel to Sankhalim for paperwork, but by decentralizing these services, the government has made it more convenient for residents to access necessary documents, significantly reducing their burden.

CSR Support

Swayampurna Mitra Shri. Satish Vaghonkar, with the support of the Lupin Human Welfare Foundation, has successfully brought multiple developmental benefits to the community of Harvalem. The partnership facilitated the following key contributions:

Toolkits for Artisans and Skilled Workers: Lupin provided toolkits for 5 masons, electricians, painters, and 1 traditional artisan, enhancing their work efficiency.

Shed for Vegetable Vendors: Understanding the need for proper infrastructure, a shed was constructed for vegetable vendors.

Support for Women Entrepreneurs: Eight sewing machines were distributed to women, empowering them to start or enhance their livelihoods.

Agricultural Support: Fifty farmers received vermi-composting bags and mineral mixtures, promoting sustainable farming practices.

Dairy Farmer Assistance: Thirty milk cans were given to local dairy farmers to improve milk storage and transportation.

Anganwadi Aid: Twenty educational charts were supplied to Anganwadis in Upper Harvalem to enhance learning for children.

Environmental Initiatives: A plantation drive saw the distribution of neem, chikoo, lime, chafa, nirfanas, rose, hibiscus, and other plant saplings to green the area under the Harvalem panchayat's jurisdiction.

Community Gatherings: A refreshment arrangement was made for 150 people, including VIPs and dignitaries, alongside floral bouquets to welcome guests.





Additional Initiatives

Tree Plantation Drive: A monsoon tree plantation drive was organized in June to promote environmental conservation.

E-Shram Card Camp: Held on 22nd December 2022, this camp helped unorganized workers register for social security benefits.

Swachh Bharat Mission Activities: Competitions and a cleanliness rally were conducted on 4th January 2023 to promote hygiene among school students.

CCTV Installation: Two CCTV cameras were installed to monitor illegal garbage dumping, a CSR initiative by Lupin Foundation, inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister.

Sewing Machines Distribution: Seven sewing machines were distributed to local women, enhancing their livelihood opportunities.

UDID and ABHA Card Camps: Camps were organized to assist people with disabilities and improve healthcare access.

Village Panchayat Harvalem's efforts have been recognized with awards for Maximum Collection of House Tax and being the Cleanest Panchayat in North Goa.

GOVAN: EMPOWERING WOMEN & FARMERS THROUGH SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOODS





GoVan project exemplifies the Goa government's commitment to fostering self-reliance and sustainable development, directly benefiting 25 women through active engagement at Multi-product Processing Centers (MPPCs) at Curchorem and Bicholim. Aligned with the Swayampurna Goa mission, the project promotes inclusivity, economic empowerment, and sustainable livelihoods by leveraging community resources and promoting local entrepreneurship.

By providing women with the tools and opportunities to engage in processing activities, the GoVan project has empowered them to contribute meaningfully to the local economy. The project also strengthens the agricultural sector by directly engaging with approximately 50 local farmers, ensuring that raw materials are sourced locally. This direct purchasing model creates a reliable income stream for farmers, fostering stronger rural economies and reducing dependencies on intermediaries.







GoVan emphasizes sustainable practices in its operations, incorporating eco-friendly packaging and promoting environmentally conscious products. This approach aligns with both conservation efforts and the growing market demand for sustainable products. By encouraging community-based enterprises focused on value addition, the project has fostered a sense of ownership, cooperation, and pride within the community.

The consistent ordering of GoVan gift hampers by government departments, private agencies, and individuals underscores the success and recognition of the project. In a strategic move to further its impact, the approval of 10 additional MPPCs through the District Mineral Foundation (DMF) will support sustainable livelihoods and diversify economic activities in mining-affected regions. This expansion is pivotal to the Swayampurna Goa vision, promoting economic resilience and self-sufficiency across diverse sectors.



ATAL GRAM DEVELOPMENT AGENCY GOA



Agency has undertaken the following programmes.

Development of Agriculture activities in V.P.Surla

Agency has implemented a novel scheme towards development of agricultural fields in the jurisdiction of Village Panchayat Surla in Bicholim Taluka. The main aim of the scheme is to transform large tracts of non cultivable land into cultivable land by adopting suitable measures. Manual Labour engaged for the above work is being paid daily wages as per the daily wage rate as approved by the Office of Commissioner, Labour and Employment, Government of Goa. Earth moving machinery viz. Backhoe Loaders/Mini-Excavator/ Excavator for removal of shrubs, undergrowth dead wood, small stones/debris and leveling of fields are engaged as requested by the farmers after following proper codal formalities. An area of around 62.400.00 sq. mts. has been made cultivable in Ward No 1 (Patoli) in the jurisdiction of V.P. Surla by following appropriate strategies. An area of 31,000.00 sq. mts. has been made cultivable in Ward No. 4 (Ambefal, Bayem-Surla) in the jurisdiction of V P. Surla. The work of manual cutting/cleaning of Bushes, Grass & other undesirable vegetation in the jurisdiction of V.P. Surla, Bicholim Goa has been completed in another plot of land admeasuring 37,400. 00 sq.mts.in Ward No. 1 and 2 (Brahma Farmers Kumare-Joshibhat-Bhile).


Cultivation of Strawberries

Atal Gram Development Agency assisted 3 Self Help Groups from Verlem viz. Bhumika Self Help Group, Shiv Shakti Self Help Group & Chandreshwar Self Help Group in the cultivation of strawberries. An area of 4900.00 sq. mts. has been brought under strawberry cultivation by Bhumika Self Help Group, Verlem (2300 sq. mts.), Shiv Shakti Self Help Group, Verlem (1400 sq. mts.) and Chandreshwar Self Help Group (1200 sq.mts.). The Agency procured and supplied 33,000 strawberry saplings from Wai village in Maharashtra State.



School Education

Implementation of e-School project at Government High Schools at Netorlim, Vaddem- Curdi in Sanguem taluka and Maina and Malkarnem in Quepem taluka: The Agency procured and supplied Interactive Smart Boards along with mini PC, UPS and Camera for Video Conferencing at Government High School, Netorlim, Vaddem-Curdi in Sanguem taluka and Maina and Malkarnem in Quepem taluka to make learning an enjoyable experience. The Agency has also made arrangements for electricity connection and LAN networking in all the schools. The introduction of Interactive Smart Boards in the schools has benefited the student community to a great extent. This facility has also benefited the teachers to explain scientific and mathematical concepts more clearly and deliver the best quality education to their students which helps the students to understand these complex concepts in an easy way.







GOA'S ECONOMIC UPLIFT: A SWAYAMPURNA GOA SUCCESS STORY



Goa has demonstrated exceptional fiscal management, achieving significant strides in revenue surplus, fiscal deficit reduction, and debt management, as recognized by the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India in its State Finances Audit Report. Despite the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, Goa's fiscal health has improved markedly, meeting most of the targets set under the Fiscal Responsibility and Budget Management (FRBM) Act and Rules.

One of the report's standout achievements is the exponential growth in Goa's revenue surplus, which surged from 59 crores in FY 2021-22 to an impressive 2,400 crores in FY 2022-23. This growth highlights the state's ability to build a solid revenue base, ensuring sustainable financial progress.

Goa has also seen a significant reduction in its fiscal deficit relative to its Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP), with the ratio falling from 3.18% in FY 2021-22 to just 1.13% in FY 2022-23. This is a testament to the government's commitment to maintaining fiscal discipline and controlling expenditure while fostering growth.

Hon'ble Chief Minister Dr. Pramod Sawant, who took office in 2019, has been instrumental in reshaping Goa's future under the "Swayampurna Goa" initiative. This visionary program, born out of the need for self-sufficiency during the pandemic, has played a pivotal role in strengthening Goa's economic foundation. A Goa government official noted that this strategic focus on self-reliance safeguarded the state's financial well-being and set it on a robust growth trajectory. It laid the foundation for a financially resilient future, ensuring economic stability while promoting Goa as a premier destination for tourism, entrepreneurship, and cultural exploration.



In its second phase, "Swayampurna Goa 2.0" focused on Skilling, Reskilling, and Upskilling initiatives, aiming to prepare Goans with industry-relevant skills that make them more employable across various sectors. This phase is closely aligned with Prime Minister Shri.Narendra Modi's Skill India mission, empowering youth, or "Yuva Shakti," to become the backbone of India's economic strength.

Goa has also been a frontrunner in implementing the New Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The state introduced skill development and vocational training programs at the school level, enhancing the employability of future generations. Initiatives such as Coding and Robotics, Vidya Samiksha Kendra, supported by the Al Chatbot Parakh, and the Mulyavardhan Programme, are designed to prepare students for future challenges and opportunities.

Combination of strong fiscal performance and forward-looking initiatives like Swayampurna Goa positions Goa as a leader in economic sustainability and innovation. With a clear focus on self-reliance, skill development, and financial prudence, Goa is paving the way for a future that is both prosperous and self-sufficient.



CODING AND ROBOTICS EDUCATION IN SCHOOLS SCHEME (CARES)



CARES Scheme aims to create a technologically proficient generation by introducing students to coding and robotics from an early age. The program focuses on providing students with hands-on experience, fostering creativity, and developing problem-solving skills. By encouraging students to engage with emerging technologies like artificial intelligence (Al), robotics, and coding, the scheme ensures that Goa's youth are not only digitally literate but also ready to compete on a global scale.

Hon'ble Chief Minister Dr. Pramod Sawant, who also serves as the Minister of Education, is a key advocate of this initiative.

Broader vision behind CARES aligns perfectly with Prime Minister Shri. Narendra Modi's Skill India mission, which seeks to create a skilled workforce that meets the demands of the modern economy. By incorporating coding and robotics into schools, Goa is nurturing a generation of innovators, critical thinkers, and future-ready professionals.

CARES Scheme was launched in 2021 with a structured plan to introduce coding and robotics education across government and government-aided schools in Goa. As part of this initiative, dedicated labs have been set up, and teachers are being trained in modern teaching methods related to programming languages, Al, and robotics. The scheme's implementation has been supported by comprehensive teacher training programs, ensuring that educators are fully prepared to guide students through these new subjects.





So far, more than 450 schools across Goa have incorporated the CARES program, reaching more than 65000 students from both government and government-aided schools. This widespread implementation ensures that every child in Goa, irrespective of their background, has access to quality education in emerging technologies.

CARES Scheme is a cornerstone of the Swayampurna Goa 2.0 initiative, which emphasizes Skilling, Reskilling, and Upskilling the Goan population to meet the challenges of the future. Hon'ble Chief Minister Dr. Pramod Sawant, in his vision for a self-sufficient and empowered state, has identified skill development as key to Goa's economic growth and competitiveness. CARES directly contributes to this goal by focusing on building a strong foundation for technological education among school students, who will eventually become part of the state's skilled workforce.





Government of Goa created Goa CSR Authority under the leadership of Hon'ble Chief Minister in January 2021, with view to optimal utilization of the CSR Funds of Public and Private institutions for the welfare of the State. This Goa CSR Authority is registered with the Ministry of Corporate Affairs, Government of India and the Registrar of Co-operative Societies, Government of Goa.

A key milestone was the first CSR Conclave 2023, held on 14th December 2023 at the New Durbar Hall, Raj Bhavan, Donapaula. The event aimed to attract corporate participation in Goa's socio-economic initiatives and saw the attendance of over 82 corporate leaders, including General Managers, CEOs, and Heads of Industries.

1. Colorcon Asia Private Limited, Verna -Through a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Colorcon Asia, Goa CSR Authority received 100 lakh to implement the "Vision for All" program. This initiative provided eye checkups for around 230,000 school children in Goa. It resulted in 253 free eye surgeries and the distribution of 1,608 spectacles to students in need. This initiative is pioneering in India for its scale and inclusivity.





2.Power Grid Corporation of India - In collaboration with Power Grid Corporation, the Goa CSR Authority facilitated the donation of medical equipment, including Advanced Life Support (ALS) ambulances, Basic Life Support (BLS) ambulances, and blood bank automation instruments to hospitals in Goa, with funding amounting to 275 lakh.

3. EduHub Sports Private Limited, Mumbai- EduHub Sports Pvt. Ltd. launched a physical fitness assessment program titled "FitnessGram" in Goan schools and colleges. The initiative, funded by Canara Bank, assessed the fitness levels of 339 students, promoting youth health and fitness literacy across the state.







- **4. TENVIC Sports Education Private Limited**, **Bengaluru -** This MoU, led by cricket legend Anil Kumble, aimed to provide a comprehensive grassroots sports training program for school children in Goa. The program is expected to span three years, encouraging long-term athlete development.
- 5. Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bengaluru IISc's flagship design-thinking program, led by Prof. Amaresh Chakrabarti, was designed for Goa's administrative officers. The training empowered government officials to implement innovative solutions, aiding in departmental and organizational growth.
- **6.** Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India (EDII), Ahmedabad With the launch of the Goa Udyamita Yojana, the EDII initiative aims to strengthen Goa's entrepreneurial ecosystem by fostering MSMEs. The institute supports entrepreneurship training, policy research, and incubation services, marking Goa as a business-friendly state.



- 7. Ather Energy Private Limited, Bengaluru In partnership with Ather Energy, the CSR Authority is working on setting up 10 electric vehicle (EV) charging stations across Goa to support the adoption of electric mobility, catering to electric two-wheelers, three-wheelers, and four-wheelers.
- **8.** National Institute of Mental Health and Neuro Sciences (NIMHANS)- NIMHANS will provide expertise on stress management, teacher education, and life skills training in line with the National Education Policy (2020), contributing to the mental well-being of students and educators in Goa.
- **9.** Central Institute of Indian Languages (CIIL), Mysuru This initiative seeks to promote Indian languages, particularly Konkani, through the development of academic resources and research collaboration. It aims to preserve and celebrate linguistic diversity in Goa.



10.Housing and Urban Development Corporation (HUDCO)-HUDCO contributed 250 lakh to procure four Advanced Cardiac Life Support ambulances. These ambulances will be used to provide emergency care, particularly to victims of road accidents.







11. Kotak Education Foundation (KEF), Mumbai -

The Goa CSR Authority and Kotak Education Foundation partnered to enhance the capacity of school leaders and teachers through instructional practices aligned with the National Education Policy, focusing on leadership development.

- 12. Dvija Naturals Private Limited, Goa Dvija Naturals, a local MSME, is providing discounted ayurvedic products for CSR healthcare activities. This collaboration highlights the promotion of indigenous health products to improve community wellbeing.
- 13. Dvija Naturals Private Limited, Assagao- Goa- The Goa CSR Authority has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Dvija Naturals Pvt Ltd., a Goa based startup MSME engaged in the production of ayurvedic medicines on 04th April 2024. Under the Memorandum of Understanding, Dvija Naturals Pvt Ltd would offer its product Dvija Heal+ at 50% discount on MRP to CSR contributors for healthcare activities. These discounted prices are inclusive of taxes and exclusive of logistics and any other operational cost.
- **14. TT Skill Development Private Limited, Chennai -** A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) has been signed with TT Skill Development Pvt Ltd on 29th April 2024 with an aim to develop and implement skill development initiatives in the domains of Logistics, Supply Chain Management, Corporate Training, Cold Chain Management for the Pharma Industry, and Travel and Tourism Sector in Goa.
- **15.** Administrative Staff College of India (ASCI), Hyderabad A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) has been signed with Administrative Staff College of India on 29th April 2024 to promote excellence in teaching, training and research. Goa CSR Authority and ASCI will partner to deliver joint training programmes to government clients and private sector. The programmes may be conducted either in ASCI, Hyderabad or in off-campus mode in Goa.
- **16. Power Finance Corporation Limited**, **New Delhi -** The CSR Authority signed an MoU with Power Finance Corporation for a grant of 400 lakh to procure medical equipment for Goa Medical College, strengthening healthcare services in the state.





17. Molbio Diagnostics Private Limited, **Goa** - Molbio Diagnostics provided critical healthcare infrastructure support through the donation of four ALS ambulances, two hearse vans, and ophthalmic equipment worth 340 lakh.



19. Colgate-Palmolive India - This initiative aims to improve oral health for school children in Goa through the "Bright Smiles, Bright Futures" program. Dental check-ups and health kits are distributed to children in 1st to 8th standards in over 1,200 schools.





18. Goa CSR Conclave - The CSR Conclave, chaired by Goa's Chief Minister, gathered over 100 corporate houses and institutions, fostering partnerships in areas such as education, skill development, healthcare, and the environment.



20. **SBI** Foundation - SBI Foundation and Goa CSR Authority are establishing a skill training and entrepreneurship development center. This project, funded by 49 lakh, focuses on empowering women and youth in Goa through vocational training.



BUILDING A SKILLED WORKFORCE



Government of Goa is prioritizing skilling, re-skilling, and up-skilling of its youth through various initiatives, programs, and policies. The Department of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship plays a pivotal role in transforming the state into a skill hub. With a network of 10 Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) and a capacity to train over 3,000 students annually, these ITIs are a key driver of Goa's skilled workforce, contributing significantly to the state's development.

In the past five years, Goa's ITIs have introduced several new-age courses to keep pace with industry trends and emerging technologies. These courses include:

- Solar Technician
- Mechanic Consumer Electronic Appliances
- Fashion Designing
- Food Production
- Multimedia Animation
- Cosmetology
- Smartphone Technician cum App Tester
- Multipurpose Health Worker
- Food & Beverage Service Assistant
- Digital Photography



These programs are designed to equip Goan youth with the skills needed to thrive in evolving job markets, both in traditional trades and modern sectors like fashion, technology, and renewable energy.







BUILDING A SKILLED WORKFORCE







In 2024, the government has taken several steps to further strengthen the skill infrastructure in the state. The Department of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship has established collaborations with corporate houses, academic institutions, and industries to enhance training facilities and introduce new, industry-relevant courses. These partnerships aim to provide students with hands-on experience and direct exposure to industry standards, improving their employability.

Through these initiatives, Goa is shaping a highly skilled workforce that meets both local and global industry demands. By investing in modern courses, collaborating with industry leaders, and upgrading its LTL infrastructure, the state is well-positioned to become a hub for skilled professionals, contributing to its overall economic growth and development.







FISHERIES: A CATCH OF PROGRESS



Government of Goa is steadfast in its commitment to enhancing the fisheries industry through a variety of supportive schemes. These initiatives are designed to improve efficiency, sustainability, and the overall livelihoods of those involved in fisheries, fostering a vibrant ecosystem for local fishermen.



INSULATED VEHICLES

Under the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY), fishermen in Goa are provided with insulated vehicles to ensure the efficient transportation of fresh fish. This initiative not only streamlines the movement of seafood but also includes vital support for fish farming equipment and infrastructure development, such as ponds and bio-toilets.

MOBILE FISH VANS

In addition, the Goa government has introduced mobile fish stalls, including Tata Winger Cargo vehicles, to bolster the fisheries sector. These mobile fish vans enhance distribution capabilities, enabling fresh seafood to reach villages directly and ensuring local communities have consistent access to quality fish products.





ECO-FRIENDLY MOVABLE FISH KIOSK MATSYA VAHINI

On September 2, 2024, the Department of Fisheries launched the Eco-Friendly Movable Fish Kiosk Matsya Vahini—Three Wheeler Scheme. This innovative initiative promotes sustainable fishing practices by offering fishermen a mobile platform to sell their catch directly to consumers, significantly increasing accessibility and market reach.



FISHERIES: A CATCH OF PROGRESS



SUBSIDIES

To further streamline operations, the Goa government provides subsidies for fish vans, motorcycles, and ice boxes. These subsidies are designed to enhance the supply chain, making it easier for fishermen to reach remote areas, thereby ensuring that communities have reliable access to fresh fish.

Through these comprehensive initiatives, the Government of Goa is not only revitalizing the fisheries industry but also empowering local fishermen and promoting sustainable practices. By improving transportation and market access, these programs significantly contribute to the overall growth and resilience of the fisheries sector in the state, illustrating a model of progress and self-sufficiency for the community.





WASTE MANAGEMENT REVOLUTION



In recent years, Goa has made significant strides in solid waste management through the efforts of the Goa Waste Management Corporation (GWMC). The state's waste management initiatives are designed to address the growing need for sustainable practices while ensuring cleanliness across cities and villages.

1. Integrated Solid Waste Management Facilities (ISWMF):

Since August 2016, Goa's ISWMF has treated over 445,000 metric tons of waste, generating an average of 28,000 units of electricity per day. This system, which has been operational for eight years, ensures that only 3% of waste is sent to landfills, while the facility generates around 8 tons of compost per day. The Manohar Parrikar ISWMF, inaugurated in 2024, stands as a modern symbol of efficiency, processing 22719 metric tons of waste and producing 10,000 units of electricity daily.

2. Biomedical and Hazardous Waste Management:

In response to the challenges posed by biomedical and hazardous waste, the GWMC established dedicated treatment facilities. The biomedical waste facility, operating on a Public-Private Partnership (PPP) model, treats 4-5 tons of waste daily, serving over 1500 healthcare facilities. Meanwhile, the hazardous waste facility, also based on a PPP model, has received 13,166 metric tons of waste and includes secured landfills and incinerators.

3. Legacy Waste Remediation:

Goa has taken on the mammoth task of remediating its legacy dumpsites. In Phase I, a total of 452,939 cubic meters of waste has been remediated, with Phase II underway to address an additional 83,857 cubic meters of waste. These efforts have drastically transformed previously polluted sites, leading to cleaner and healthier environments.

4. Public Awareness and Secondary Waste Collection:

Public participation is key to the success of Goa's waste management. GWMC organizes frequent road cleaning schedules, collecting litter along highways and district roads. Additionally, since 2013, 21,621 tons of waste have been collected from village panchayats, with schools also contributing 1,181 tons since 2014.

5. Recycling Initiatives - The 'POTI' Project:

One of the standout initiatives is the "POTI – Protection of Oceans, Trees, & Inhabitants" project, which encourages the public to recycle clothes. For every 2kg of used clothes donated, citizens receive a recycled cloth bag. This project aims to reduce the use of plastic bags and promote ecofriendly practices.

6. Recognition and Knowledge Sharing:

The GWMC's expertise in waste management has earned it recognition as a Swachhata Knowledge Partner (SKP) under the Swachh Bharat Mission 2.0 by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs. This distinction showcases the corporation's leadership in managing waste-related issues and building capacity across the nation.

Through these innovative projects, GWMC has successfully positioned Goa as a leading state in India for waste management. By focusing on sustainability and community involvement, Goa is shaping a cleaner and greener future for all its residents.

CHIEF MINISTER APPRENTICESHIP SCHEME



Chief Minister Apprenticeship Scheme, initiated by the Government of Goa, offers Goan youth a unique opportunity to gain hands-on training and experience in both government and private establishments. Originally designed for students with a technical background, such as those from Polytechnic and ITI institutes, the scheme has been expanded through the Chief Minister Apprenticeship Policy to include students with non-technical backgrounds as well. This makes Goa the first state in India to offer such a platform to youth with non-technical skills, enhancing their employability across various sectors.

Chief Minister Apprenticeship Policy was introduced to bridge the gap between education and employability. While earlier versions of the scheme catered exclusively to technically trained students, the new policy opens doors for non-technical students to gain practical work experience in government and private organizations. The initiative aims to make Goan youth more job-ready by equipping them with essential skills and experience, regardless of their academic background.

To streamline the process, candidate registration is done through the National Apprenticeship Portal (NAP), where both candidates and establishments can register. This portal serves as a platform for matching youth with apprenticeship opportunities, making it easier for companies to recruit and for students to find relevant training.

Due to the government's dedicated efforts, over 18,000 youth have already joined the Chief Minister's Apprenticeship Programme in both government and private companies. During the apprenticeship period, trainees receive a monthly stipend ranging from 8,000 to 13,000, helping them financially while they acquire valuable work experience. Upon successful completion of the training, apprentices receive a certificate, further enhancing their employability.





In a grand celebration of youth skills, the World Youth Skill Day was held on 15th July 2023 at the Taleigao Community Hall. During the event, more than 5,000 apprenticeship contracts were distributed to candidates by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, marking a significant milestone in the scheme's success.



REFRESHER TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR TALUKA NODAL OFFICERS AND SWAYAMPURNA MITRAS



On September 26th and 27th, 2024, a refresher training programme was held at the Directorate of Art and Culture for all Taluka Nodal Officers and Swayampurna Mitras, organized by the Directorate of Planning, Statistics, and Evaluation under the Swayampurna Goa Programme.

The training featured various presentations aimed at enhancing the effectiveness of the participants:

- New India Literacy Programme (NILP): The Director of the State Council of Education, Research, and Training (SCERT) outlined a comprehensive roadmap to achieve the goal of 100% literacy in Goa.

- Goa Energy Development Agency: The Member Secretary highlighted the benefits of the Pradhan Mantri Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana, promoting solar energy solutions for households.

Additionally, Swayampurna Mitras, including Dr. Ajay Gaude, MD of the Handicrafts Corporation; Shri Subraj Kanekar, Joint Director at the Directorate of Accounts; and Shri Rohan Ghadi, Deputy Manager at the Goa Waste Management Corporation, shared their experiences and best practices as Swayampurna Mitras.

Project Manager from Goa Electronics Limited (GEL) provided insights into the Swayampurna Goa reporting portal, designed for real-time monitoring of the program. GEL set up counters to assist Swayampurna Mitras in registering and uploading their reports effectively.

This training program aimed to equip participants with the knowledge and tools necessary to drive the Swayampurna Goa initiative forward, fostering community development and empowerment across the state.

The PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana aims to increase the share of solar rooftop capacity and empower residential households to generate their own electricity. The scheme has a budget of Rs 75,021 crore and will be implemented until FY 2026-27.

Under the Goem Vinamulya Vij Yevjan, the Government of Goa, with an initial investment of 35 Crore, will cover the balance cost of rooftop installations up to 5kW for consumers who have consumed 400 units or less in the past year. This is in addition to the Central Financial Assistance provided by the PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana.





Directorate of Planning, Statistics, and Evaluation, in partnership with the Bicholim Progressive Farmers Producer Company Limited, held a transformative training program for Swayampurna Mitras and Taluka Nodal Officers in Bicholim Taluka. This initiative sought to empower farmers by identifying those who had left their lands uncultivated and offering specialized training in modern, sustainable cropping techniques. Dairy farmers were also encouraged to embrace green fodder cultivation, a forward-thinking practice aimed at enhancing dairy productivity while promoting environmental sustainability. The program was an integral step in advancing the vision of the Swayampurna Goa initiative, fostering self-reliance and sustainable growth within the region.

This comprehensive approach not only targeted increased agricultural output but also embraced innovative practices to ensure the long-term viability of farming and dairy production in Bicholim. The success of such initiatives marks a significant stride in local development efforts, bringing farmers and government representatives together to build a more prosperous, resilient future for the community.











In order to encourage the farmers to go in for dairy business and make it more lucrative which will help in increasing the local milk production, subsidy is provided to the farmers under this scheme. During the year 2023-24 (upto December 2023), a composite subsidy @40% amounting to 2402.50 lakh has been released to the registered farmers for milk supplied to the Dairy Cooperative Society/Bachat Gat/Self Help Group. This scheme has more than 72000 beneficiaries.

Goa Startup Policy Seed Capital Scheme offers a valuable opportunity for promising startups in Goa to receive financial support and accelerate their growth. This initiative aligns with the broader goals of Swayampurna Goa by fostering innovation, entrepreneurship, and self-sufficiency. Startups with promising ideas can apply for a one-time grant of up to INR 10 lakh, determined by the Start-up Promotion Cell (SPC). By providing seed capital and support services, the Goa Startup Policy Seed Capital Scheme aims to empower entrepreneurs and contribute to the development of a vibrant startup ecosystem in the state. This initiative is a crucial step towards achieving Swayampurna Goa's vision of a self-sufficient and innovative Goa.







Home enrollment facility introduced in 2023 for senior citizens, bedridden individuals, and divyangjan aligns with the goals of the Swayampurna Goa initiative by fostering inclusivity and accessibility. This service reflects the initiative's emphasis on reaching every segment of society, ensuring that even the most vulnerable have easy access to essential services like Aadhaar enrollment. By enabling online submissions of the Annual Life Certificate through the Jeevan Pramaan Portal, it further promotes self-reliance, a key pillar of Swayampurna Goa.







Interest subsidy program by Government of Goa, offering a 4% interest subsidy in addition to the central government's 3% subsidy, is a key element of the Swayampurna Goa initiative. It promotes self-reliance by making agriculture more financially viable for farmers. By easing the financial burden through low-interest crop loans of up to 5 lakh, the program encourages farmers to pursue agriculture as a lucrative activity, aligning with Swayampurna Goa's goals of sustainable development and economic empowerment in rural areas. This scheme has more than 12000 beneficiaries.

Directorate of Fisheries has appointed 38 Sagar Mitra to enhance outreach and raise awareness among local fishermen about government schemes, policies, programs, and regulations implemented by the Government.



In addition to raising awareness among local fishermen about various government schemes, 38 Sagar Mitra have been appointed to actively promote aquaculture. They provide essential fisheries-related training, technical know-how, and handson assistance to the fishing communities.

Sagar Mitra also play a vital role in simplifying the process for fishermen by helping them complete the necessary paperwork to access government schemes. Their comprehensive support ensures that fishermen are equipped with the knowledge and resources needed to enhance their livelihoods and contribute to the sustainable growth of the fisheries and aqua culture sectors.





In alignment with the Aatmanirbhar Bharat and Swayampurna Goa missions, Usgao-Ganjem village panchayat in Ponda taluka has taken significant steps towards self-reliance by generating its own electricity through a solar power grid..

Funded by a 15 lakh grant from the 15th Finance Commission and government subsidies, the solar project ensures energy independence for the panchayat. Of the power generated, 50 units are consumed, with plans to expand capacity and potentially sell excess power back to the government.

1. Live interaction on special drive under waste management for Municipalities and Village Panchayats of Goa.

Additionally, smart healthcare services such as telemedicine will be introduced, improving access to healthcare in the village. Schools will also receive technological upgrades to enhance the learning experience, ensuring that students have the opportunity to learn essential digital skills from an early age.
